My opinion is that starting a heavy equipment repair and maintenance operation at 6:30 AM every day is not reasonable for the abutting neighborhood. Also, the Company has not been clear on how many days per week they're proposing.

The Company said in the July 2022 public hearing that they work normal business hours, which everyone knows to mean 40 hours a week during weekdays. If they start talking about weekend work, too, that makes this proposal even more offensive.

The current proposed setback is only 100 feet, and the vegetation in that northern vegetated area is not densely populated. 100 feet sounds like a lot, but that's only 1/3 of a football field. Heavy equipment will be moving around, plus repair work will be done outside in some cases or worked on inside with overhead doors frequently open during good weather.

I agree with others that 100 feet of buffer isn't enough. But I feel even more strongly that neighbors waking up every morning at 630 AM to the sound of heavy equipment repair is too much to ask.
