I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Vincent called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Conference Room of the Town Hall Annex Building. Chairman Vincent welcomed all to the Hybrid Meeting.

III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A. August 2, 2022 Regular Meeting Minutes

IV. CITIZENS COMMENTS

V. MAYOR'S REPORT

Not present.

VI. PLANNER'S REPORT

Plans for property near McDonalds have been submitted. Vincent expressed concern about the proximity of the Whalehead Rd./Rt. 12 intersection near that property as well as where Rt. 12 heading north narrows from two lanes to one and wondered where their driveway would be located. Hodge said they hadn't gotten encroachment permit from the state.

Approved 3 short term rentals and dealing with a couple others.

Will be meeting with Mike Cherry and Attorney Heller tomorrow about Cashman property.

Zoning regulations changes should be voted on this Thursday. Buhle asked if the survey that Mike Cherry had posted online was in regard to these changes. Hodge said that it was not, that it was for the housing plan and asked everyone to take the survey if they haven't already. Housing plan needs to be completed by October.

VII. OLD BUSINESS

A. Development of Strategic Plan

Hodge pointed out that there are a lot of things on the CEDAS Best Practices check list that Ledyard hasn't done. Also, the Plan of Conservation and Development frequently refers to the goals in the 1998 Mullins Plan plan which is very old and likely is no longer relevant. We need to develop a vision for the town to guide the strategic plan. Perhaps we should address that at the Joint Commissions meeting scheduled for Oct. 18th so that everyone has input for the vision and is working toward the same goal. Dreimiller will collate all of the goals suggestions.

B. Rt. 12 Corridor Study

On hold until October.

C. SeCTer Data Report (Juliet)

Provided by Hodge. Breaks town's population into pre-defined categories and each category has a profile (number of people in the household, income, spending habits, etc). Provides some insight into the types of businesses/services might do well in town. Useful information for helping to develop a strategic plan. They didn't go a Gap Analysis but we can ask them to.

D. Business Directory Update (Pete)

Hodge shared a list of new businesses by year from 2017-2021. Each commissioner selected one year to review to determine if those businesses are still in business.

E. New Business Brochure (Juliet and Mike)

Hodge provided some contact information updates. Dreimiller will correct existing brochure. A redesign of the brochure will be discussed at our next meeting.

F. AdvancedCT Membership Funding (Mayor)

Dreimiller located a document on the Town's website titled "Fiscal Year 2023 Adopted Budgets" which shows that the 2022-23 EDC budget is \$6,850. So the budget that had been intended for the AdvanceCT membership, which was not renewed, appears to still be in the EDC budget.

G. Ledyard Events Magazine Submission (Mayor/Jessica)

The Sunnyside Diner ribbon cutting article and the Up-Down Sawmill article both made it into Fall issue of Events magazine. Submissions deadline for Winter issue is Oct. 17th. We should have some ribbon cuttings that we can feature.

H. Ribbon Cuttings - Scheduling (John)

Nothing scheduled yet but Puerto Lima, My Pets World, Lucille's Café, Coastal Mudworks (pottery studio), Lucky's Nail Salon and Spa (new owner), and Mohegan Trading Store are interested.

I. Selection of EDC Members to attend Agricultural Commission's proposed Joint Meeting on 10/18/22 at 6PM (John)

Chairman Vincent and Vice Chairman Tashea will be our two representatives and Commissioner Buhle is the alternate if needed.

VIII. NEW BUSINESS

A. The ARC Recycling Project.

ARC supports people with disabilities. Their Donation Station program places bottle recycling bins and the bottle return fees are collected for ARC. Most local towns are already participating. They have two sizes of bins, a large size that would be suitable for a location like the Transfer

Station, as well as a smaller size. Schneider suggested that they could place two of their Donation Station bottle recycling bins in Ledyard (perhaps at the Transfer Station) and Gales Ferry (perhaps Ocean State Job Lot or CVS).

Demographic Profile

The population in Ledyard was 14,652 per American Community Survey data for 2015-2019.

The region has a civilian labor force of 7,433 with a participation rate of 68.3%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Ledyard, 41.5% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 33.5% in the nation.

The median household income in Ledyard is \$95,245 and the median house value is \$236,631.



Employment Trends

As of 2021Q4, total employment for Ledyard was 7,798 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2021Q4, employment increased 0.7% in the region.



Wage Trends

The average worker in Ledyard earned annual wages of \$51,963 as of 2021Q4. Average annual wages per worker increased 6.9% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$65,055 in the nation as of 2021Q4.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost-of-Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 8.6% higher in Ledyard CT than the U.S. average.



Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in Ledyard is Accommodation and Food Services, employing 4,007 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Public Administration (932 workers) and Retail Trade (641). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Accommodation and Food Services (LQ = 6.41), Public Administration (2.50), and Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (1.69).

Employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2021Q3 with preliminary estimates updated to 2021Q4.

Sectors in Ledyard with the highest average wages per worker are Information (\$299,258), Management of Companies and Enterprises (\$119,741), and Manufacturing (\$109,618). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 5 years are Accommodation and Food Services (+3,029 jobs), Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services (+110), and Retail Trade (+104).

Over the next year, employment in Ledyard is projected to expand by 30 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation with a +1.7% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Accommodation and Food Services (+57 jobs), Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (+4), and Transportation and Warehousing (+1).

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in Ledyard is Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations, employing 1,587 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Personal Care and Service Occupations (1,063 workers) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (793). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Personal Care and Service Occupations (LQ = 5.44), Protective Service Occupations (3.30), and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (2.61).

Occupation groups in Ledyard with the highest average wages per worker are Management Occupations (\$128,200), Legal Occupations (\$109,100), and Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$105,000). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.7% among Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations to 10.9% among Personal Care and Service Occupations.

Over the next year, the fastest growing occupation group in Ledyard is expected to be Personal Care and Service Occupations with a +1.6% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+23 jobs) and Personal Care and Service Occupations (+17). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (288 jobs) and Personal Care and Service Occupations (155).



Employment in the Consumer Svc. cluster is projected to expand in the region about 1.4% per year over the next ten years.

Industry Clusters for Ledyard CT as of 2021Q4






Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Ledyard is projected to grow 0.4% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to contract 0.6% per year, those requiring a bachelor’s degree are forecast to contract 0.1% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to contract 0.2% per year.

FAQ

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a competitive advantage in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the “all industry” level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the “sector,” which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 804 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 22 major groups, 95 minor groups, and 452 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.




Self-Employment Rate*

Catchment Areas of 15mi, 30mi, and 60mi












Top Ten Tapestry Segments Site vs. U.S.








