I wanted to share a quick update and some good news. Ledyard Public Schools has been recognized by the Northeast PBIS Network as a Silver level district of distinction. This reflects the consistency and commitment we've been building across our district schools.

There's a lot of work that goes into this, and I want to recognize our school admin, PBIS teams, staff, and Anne for leading and supporting this work every day. It's a nice moment for the district and a recognition of the systems we've been putting in place for students. We started this effort in 2017 after a lot of conversation and concerns about the climate and culture in our schools.
