Dear Dam Owner,

According to municipal land records, you are the owner of the above-named dam. Your dam was registered, in accordance with Section 22a-409(b) of the Connecticut General Statutes (CGS), by the previous owner of the subject dam. In order to reflect the current ownership, we have issued a Certificate of Dam Registration (CDR) and have enclosed it with this letter.

Please keep this CDR in your records. Dam owners are strongly encouraged to maintain a permanent file of all documentation relating to their dam. In the event that the ownership of the property the dam is located on is transferred, please complete the lower portion of the certificate and return it to this office by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, no later than ten days after the date of transfer. This will satisfy your responsibility to notify the State of the sale or transfer of a dam or similar structure as required by Section 22a-409(b) of the General Statutes.

Please note that if the condition and/or land use downstream of the dam change, a new determination on the dam's hazard classification will need to be obtained from DEEP. In order to maintain the structural integrity and operational safety of your dam, it is recommended that you review Section 22a-409-2 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies and the DEEP Dam Safety Program website: <https://portal.ct.gov/DEEP/Water/Dams/Dams-Safety>.

<p>Please note: Maintenance and inspection requirements of all “AA” dams fall under the jurisdiction of the municipality where the dam is located (except for state-owned dams). Removal or re-build proposals for “AA” hazard class dams must be reviewed by the DEEP Land and Water Resources Regulatory Section for a permit need determination pursuant to the Water Diversion Policy Act.</p>			
A (low)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • damage to agricultural land • damage to unimproved roadways • minimal economic loss 	Every 10 years	Not required
BB (moderate)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • damage to normally unoccupied storage structures • damage to low volume roadways • moderate economic loss 	Every 7 years	Not required
B (significant)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • possible loss of life • minor damage to habitable structures, residences, hospitals, convalescent homes, schools, etc. • damage to or interruption of the use of service of utilities • damage to primary roadways and railroads • significant economic loss 	Every 5 years	Required
