PARKS RECREATION AND SENIOR CITIZENS COMMISSION Director's Report November 2025

Please note this update for your review.

1. <u>Commission Meeting:</u>

The special meeting of the Commission is scheduled for Tuesday, November 4th, 2025, at 7:00 PM, in the Ledyard Senior Center. Please contact the office immediately if you will not be able to attend.

2. Judge Crandall Doors:

The lower garage doors at Judge Crandall have been replaced.

3. <u>Judge Crandall Field Lights:</u>

We had a light fall off the pole in a wind storm and the light has been replaced with a new LED fixture. When reppalcing the fixture it was noticed the bolts securing the fixtures were lose. Since we already had the lift on site we took full advantage and tightend all the bolts, realigned the lights, and replaced any bulbs that were out.

4. Senior Center ARPA:

Public Works has finished laying the gym flooring and we have assembled the workout equipment. Working on developing policies, procedures and release forms so we can allow the public to start using it.

5. GFCC Tennis/ Basketball Courts:

The GFCC tennis and basketball court work is complete. Not all of the fence footings needed to be replaced and to prevent any loss of grant funds the company agreed to install 2 new basketball standards in place of the fence footings. The courts came out great and we have received a lot of positive feedback from residents.

6. Blonders Bathroom:

We have had recurring issues with 2 of the toilets in the bathroom at Blonders. Both have toilets have been replaced and it might be smart to think about replacing the other toilets in the future.

Chairman DiRico called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. at the Ledyard Senior Center.

V. MEMBER COMMENTS

Ms. Schneider inquired about the availability of painting classes, noting that many seniors have begun attending the Groton Senior Center since Ledyard is not currently offering them. Mr. Johnson responded that he has been in contact with other groups, trying to get a new painting

instructor.

Ms. Crocker shared that several seniors have expressed discomfort in communicating directly with staff. She suggested that they be encouraged to submit questions or concerns through the suggestion box.

A question was raised regarding whether the senior center van was decorated and participated in the Memorial Day Parade. Mr. Johnson confirmed that the idea had been discussed, but due to a lack of available drivers, the van did not participate this year. He stated they plan to participate next year.

A follow-up question was asked about who authorized a single person to represent the Senior Center in the parade. Mr. Johnson stated he was unaware of such representation. Ms. Crocker provided a photo showing a car in the parade with a "Ledyard Senior Center" sign. Mr. Johnson said he would follow up with the individual involved.

It was asked whether the van would provide transportation to the Farmers Market. Mr. Johnson replied that rides are being planned, but they will not be offered weekly. Specific dates will be announced soon.

Concerns were raised about seniors being required to leave before scheduled activities were completed. Mr. Johnson explained that this was previously due to a shortage of drivers, but now that additional drivers have been hired, van service will be extended until 2:30 p.m.

Street Light Request (January 2024): Mr. Johnson reported that he had no update at the time but would follow up.

Ms. Crocker provided a timeline for the community garden proposal originally submitted in October 2022 and approved with allocated funds. Despite regular follow-ups, no action was taken until October 2023, when Public Works removed the existing garden. It was later announced in June 2025 that the Boy Scouts would complete the garden as an Eagle Scout project. Ms. Crocker expressed frustration with the multi-year delay and compared the situation to the exercise room renovation, which has similarly stalled.

Ms. Crocker recommended that if the scouts are unable to complete the project promptly, the town consider reaching out to the Eastern CT Community Garden Association (getgrowingct.org)

Ms. Crocker questioned whether a similar delay would occur if the project were for Parks & Recreation. Mr. Johnson responded that such projects would not face the same delays because they are typically contracted out.

Ms. Crocker requested that all Facebook posts be proofread before publication, citing a recent post that incorrectly listed the date of the Juneteenth closure as Wednesday, June 19, instead of Thursday. Ms. Schneider added that posts should include specific dates and times instead of relative terms like "tomorrow."

Ms. Crocker noted a significant drop in activity and class participation since the center's reopening after renovations. Feedback from seniors indicated disappointment, as they believed only new flooring had been installed, with no painting or visible improvements made to the large common rooms. The exercise room has yet to be addressed, and it was recently stated that work on it would not begin until winter. Ms. Crocker had hoped the exercise room would increase attendance at the center.

Mr. Johnson emphasized that he spends approximately 90% of his time addressing senior-related matters.

VI. REPORTS

1. July 2025 Directors Report

All 3 contracts have been signed. We have happy to report that the new mowing company is doing a fantastic job so far. We have noticed that they focus on the little things such as picking up trash and moving equipment/goals to ensure the properties look the best they can.

Repairs to the basketball and tennis courts are coming along in Gales Ferry. We experienced delays due to rain and extreme heat but have been fortunate to have a few nice days this week.

A replacement net climber and climbing wall rocks have been ordered to make necessary repairs to the Gales Ferry Community Center playscape.

Playground woodchips have been ordered and are scheduled to start being delivered this week. We will purchase rubber matting with excess mulch money.

All info has been submitted and the ECTC Grant is officially in place for this fiscal year. The dial-a-ride, voucher program, and caregiver reimbursement will all continue without any funding cuts.

Beach sand has been delivered and is ready to spread at Highlands Lake.

We have received 3 quotes and are working with overhead door to schedule the replacement of the lower garage doors at Judge Crandall.

Mr. Barnes asked if the pond had been stocked. Mr. Johnson responded that DEEP never got back to him.



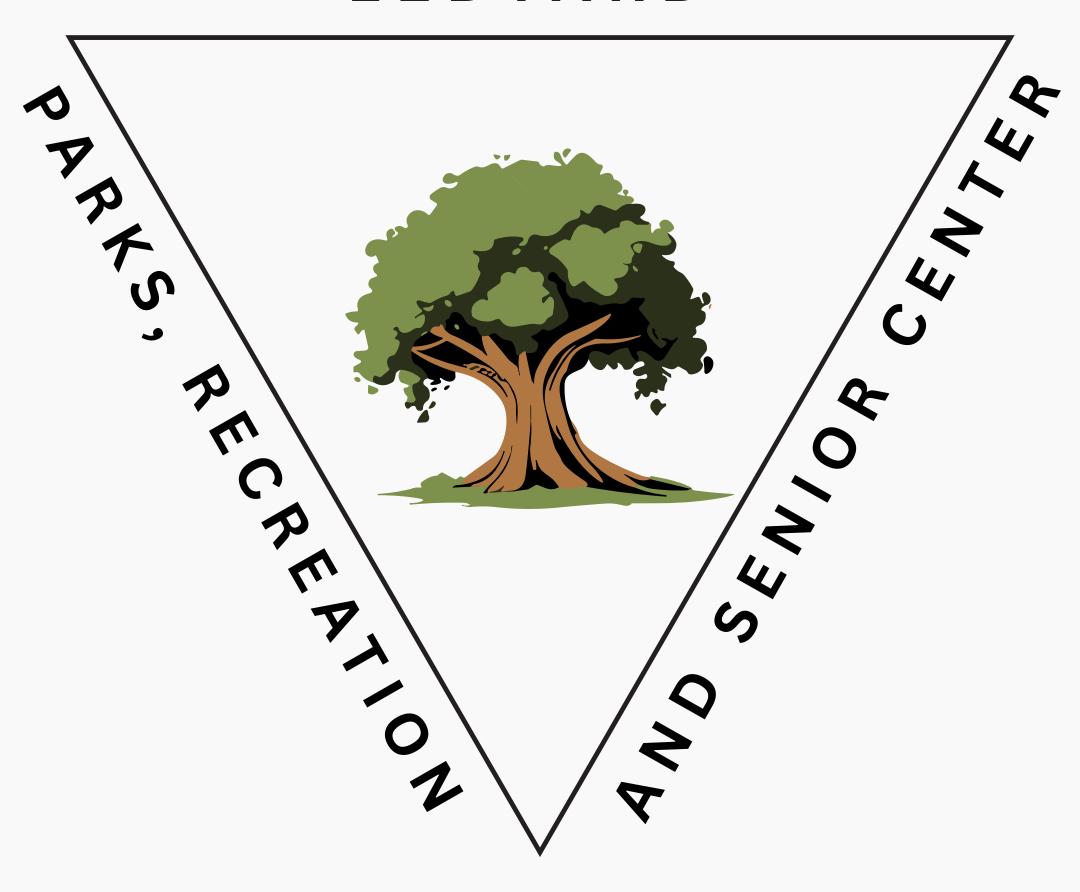

Donations

Between the Ledyard Parks, Recreation, and Senior Center, we have received over \$5,500! This has helped us provide more for the community, and run more programs/events. We have also received many walkers, puzzles, craft supplies, and books as well! In addition to this, various groups take donations and returns here as well. We will do Prescription Drug Take Backs on advertised days, and also have a bottle collection center from the ARC!



Program Registrations

Our Senior Programs had a total of 114 registrations for classes and 36 registrations for trips.

Notably, Summer camp has taken a large amount of registrations. We had a total of 1,116 registrations this summer.

- Followers: We have 918 followers, reflecting a committed community.




Public Facility Use

Our town's facilities were actively utilized by the community throughout the year. Below, you'll find detailed summaries of facility reservations and usage hours, highlighting the engagement and importance of these spaces in supporting local activities and events. This data does not include all programs we run.

Key Highlights

- Gales Ferry Community Center was the most utilized facility with 79 reservations, totaling 418 hours and 30 minutes.
- Ledyard Senior Center had the second-highest number of reservations with 77, amounting to 351 hours.
- Colonel Ledyard Park saw significant use with 38 reservations and 231 hours and 30 minutes.
- Smaller parks like Sawmill Park and Erickson Park had fewer reservations but still played a role in community activities.



Overall, the data reflects impressive community engagement with our town's facilities. The high reservation and usage rates at key locations like the Gales Ferry Community Center and Ledyard Senior Center showcase their value as central hubs for community activities. Even smaller parks and facilities contributed to the community's vibrancy, offering spaces for various events and gatherings throughout the year.

Over 700 kids showed up to our Trunk or Treat and around 400 showed up to the Egg Hunt. We held our second ever Fencing Tournament and raised over double what we did last year for the program! As well as this, we hosted our first Tennis Tournament which fundraised over \$1000 to the Nic Pelligrino Scholarship Fund!

We also hosted Shining Stars for the 5th Graders to talk to our seniors and play games, we held various lunch parties (Christmas, St. Patrick's Day, Halloween, Thanksgiving, Easter, ect.) and we even that year in the Memorial Day Parade!

HAIR SALON

Our Ledyard Nurse will take your blood pressure the second Wednesday of every month from 11 a.m. to noon. Karen will counsel seniors on their meds, healthy eating habits and exercise.

To disseminate information to elderly persons and assisting such persons in learning about community resources which are available to the public.

SENIOR CENTER CAFÉ

Join us for delicious and affordable (\$3 - \$5) breakfast and lunch menu items, Monday through Friday, here at the Senior Center.

WEEKLY WEDNESDAY LUNCH


We offer a weekly Wednesday lunch, including dessert, for \$10.00. We offer Curbside Pickup and Dine in options. This year we served 1139 lunches. This service is available to the general public, though it is most advertised to our seniors.

BREAKFAST BUFFET

This year we had 1,342 people filling plates at our Breakfast Buffet that is every Tuesday morning for \$7! We serve eggs, bacon, sausage, pancakes, and home fries. This is open to the general public.

TVCCA MEALS ON WHEELS

Our Meals on Wheels program provides meals to our homebound seniors, as well as low income seniors. We have many who utilize this program.



Transportation Services

The Ledyard Senior Center offers daily transportation to the Center for activities including lunch, along with rides to medical appointments and other necessities according to the schedule below. All individuals using our transportation complete an annual transportation form so we can stay updated with all medical conditions, as well as the utilization of our services. A wheelchair lift is available on 2 of the vehicles. We recently got a new mini-van to use for transportation as well. We service Ledyard, Gales Ferry, New London, Groton, Mystic, Waterford, Norwich and other towns in New London County.


