Attorney Brian Smith of Robinson & Cole, 1 State Street, Hartford, representing C. R. Klewin, LLC., introduced the application to the Commission. Hannah Gienau, Zoning Enforcement Official, read her staff memo into the record marked as FD#7.

Director Burdick stated that the application has been referred out to CLA Engineering who reviewed the original application submission in 2024 that had been withdrawn.
