1. Financial Reports

Total available budget = \$2,128.07, no change since last meeting.

V. OLD BUSINESS

1. Facebook page continued

Ms. Kohrs was granted access as an administrator to the Facebook page.

The Face Book page was originally set up as a business page which makes it a bit harder to promote things. Ms. Kohrs said it may be easier to create a new page than try to change the existing page. There hasn't been a lot of historical activity so there would not be much to lose. The old page could direct followers to the new page.

The transition would be from a Business page to a Community Organization page.

Currently there are 562 followers.

The other Committee members agreed that creating a new page would be better. Ms. Kohrs will work on creating a new LBC Community organization page.

2. Pots of plants at Police Station and storage of pots

There are five pots total: two at the Police Station, two at Town Hall and one at the Town Hall Annex.

Chairperson Eastbourne was concerned that the flowerpots would be missed if taken away permanently from the Police Station and moved the Senior Center. Ms. Brousseau said she did not think that would be an issue.

Chairperson Eastbourne suggested asking either the Boy or Girl Scouts to sponsor the pots. It was suggested that the Committee donates the pots to the Town instead of getting in the middle of the Town and the Scout project, the Committee agreed.

Councilor Rodriguez suggested keeping two pots for the front of the Town Hall and having the Town be responsible for planting and maintaining the pots. It was decided instead that four of the pots would be donated to the Senior Center and the fifth one be kept in front of the Annex. The Committee will ask Ms. Maher if she would like flowers placed in the pots or if she would rather plant her own. If she decides to have the Committee plant the flowers it will be explained that this is the last year they will plant them, next year the Town will be responsible.

3. Motion to AUTHORIZE DDI Signs.com to produce fourteen 24"x36" full color double sided wind mess banners with reinforced hems, pole pockets with grommets in corners for attaching to existing pole banner brackets previously ordered for a total of \$1,455.00.

The banners are ready to be ordered with pictures given to Steve Masalin, Public Works Director by former Chairperson Robinson.

A friendly amendment was made to add "upon approval of digital images" at the end of the motion. Chairperson Eastbourne will contact Mr. Masalin to review images.
