Hello Ms. Burdick,

I have two requests concerning tomorrow night's meeting. The first is that due to previous land use in greenhouses, I believe that soil PFAS testing be done. The second is the site soil profile is absent and it was excavated in the early sixties thus retains none of the characteristics of Agawam fine sandy loam as listed on the soils map. The permeability of the substratum is very rapid with its fine sand and gravel mix. I would ask that numerous test holes be dug in the area of leaching by an entity that is going to deposit as much water as contained in an Olympic pool everyday to the site not exactly a tremendous distance from the water body at the site. Furthermore the water body has dead drowned trees indicating that muskrats and beavers are present close by further raising the water table. The filtering effect of the sand and gravel will be in my opinion very minimal as the water table is very close to the surface. I urge you to reject this application.
