My name is Doug Kelley, and I live here.

It is my 68th birthday and I have chosen to spend it here with you, my friends and neighbors.

This date is significant to me not only as my natal day, but also because my parents - then Lieutenant Warren Kelley and Barbara Kelley - bought the old house on Pinelock Drive the day after, when I was two years old. As I have no memory of their previous duty stations, Pinelock and Gales Ferry remain my earliest recollections.

It would be easy to describe those early years as idyllic - growing up on the banks of Long Cove - and freely wandering the woods and skating on the ice. I remember too, though, the Cold War duck and cover drills at the old Gales Ferry Elementary School, and the day the USS Thresher went down, taking with her the fathers of some of my second grade classmates. My mother too was lost that same year, and she is at rest in the Gales Ferry Cemetery.

While she did not know it, her own ancestor settled just upriver in the 1640s at a place which used to be part of Ledyard known as Brewster's Neck. My great-grandson is now the 15th generation of his family to live in Gales Ferry.

"What does all this ancient history have to do with this matter," you may ask.

I believe all these people who came before us had the same basic desires as we do today - to live in peace with their neighbors; to make an honest living; and together to build a thriving community where the blessings of Liberty could be enjoyed by all, and not only the few.
